Modules 1, 2, 3 are a series and it is recommended they be taken together. Modules 1, 2, 3, and 7 provide a deep dive into teaching the fundamentals of reading and spelling if taken as a series.

**Module 1 is a pre-requisite for all other modules.*

June 10, 2019

Module 1 (Pre-requisite for all other modules): The Challenge of Learning to Read

Participants will learn how the brain works when we read, the components of effective reading instruction, and why some students struggle to read.

June 11, 2019

Module 2: The Speech Sounds of English: Phonetics, Phonology, and Phoneme Awareness

Participants will learn best practices for teaching phonological awareness and will discover all the speech sounds of English.

June 12, 2019

Module 3: Spellography for Teachers: How English Spelling Works

Explores the history of English spelling and explains why words are spelled in certain ways (there is almost always a reason!). Participants will come away with a better understanding of how to teach spelling from multiple angles.

June 24, 2019

Module 7: Teaching Phonics, Word Study, and the Alphabetic Principle

Provides an in-depth study of effective, systematic phonics instruction. This module provides a lesson plan framework for teachers to use when teaching phonics.

July 1, 2019

Module 9: Teaching Beginning Spelling and Writing

Explores the foundational skills that underlie composition. This module begins with a focus on sentence structure and moves through how to teach the three phases of writing.
